**LAKE TAHOE** is producing large numbers of Mackinaw. The **AMERICAN RIVER** shad run is over for 2016. At **LAKE PARDEE** the kokanee fishing is still good but the fish are being found below 90 feet with trolling speeds at one mph. Catfish fishing is good. Big kokanee are being caught by some at **NEW MELONS**. The fishing is best high in the water column. At **RED, SILVER, AND CAPLES LAKES** the fishing is very slow. At **RANCHO SECO LAKE** trout fishing has slowed but bass and bluegill fishing is good. The **CARSON RIVER** was recently planted with rainbow trout and should still be a good choice for fishing. The **SAN JOAQUIN DELTA REGION** is producing a good amount of largemouth bass, but with the triple-digit temperature the bass are looking for shade.
