Please start thinking and putting together some trips for 2018. It is coming up really quick!

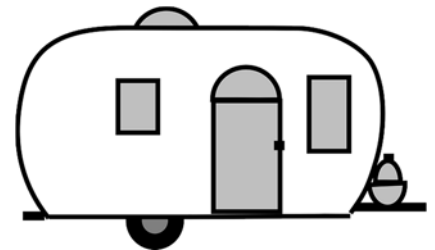

FISHING CLUB

You may not be aware of a change in "bag limit" for fish. BAG LIMIT FOR TROUT AND KOKANEE. When trout and kokanee occur in the same lake, are their bag limits separate or combined? Could five trout equal one limit and five kokanee equal another separate bag limit? In 2015, a regulation was adopted by the Fish and Game Commission to expand angler opportunity and define kokanee as an inland salmon. Since kokanee are considered land-locked salmon and not trout (CCR Title 14, section 1.57), the bag and possession limits for each species are separate, not combined.
